5. Attempt any *one* part of the following: 10 x 1 = 10
- (a) A steel tape was exactly 40cm long at 20⁰c when supported under a load of 10kg. A line was measured under the load of 15kg under the temperature of 32⁰c and found to be 780 m long. The cross-sectional area of tape = .03cm², total weight of tape = .0693kg, α for steel = 11×10^{-6} per ⁰C, E for steel = 2.1×10^6 kg/cm². Compute the true length of line if tape is supported at every 30m.
- (b) Two straight lines AC and CB to be connected by a 3⁰C intersect at a chainage of 2760 m. The WCB of AC and CB are 45⁰30' and 75⁰30' respectively. Calculate the radians, tangent length, curve length, length of long chord, chainage of point commencement and tangency.
6. Attempt any *one* part of the following: 10 x 1 = 10
- a) A line was measured by a 20m chain which was accurate before starting the day's work. After chaining 900m, the chain was found to be 6cm too long. After chaining a total distance of 1575m, the chain was found to be 14cm too long. Find the true distance of the line.
- b) Two parallel lines 200m apart are to be joined by a reverse curve with the starting point of the curve 1500m, calculate the radius of the second arc, the chainage of the point of reverse curvature, and the finishing point of the reverse curve.

- (a) Discuss in detail the procedure used for the measurement of horizontal angle by repetition method.
- (b) Two tangents AB and BC meet at B, the deflection angle being 40⁰. It is proposed to connect AB and BC with a circular curve passing through a point P. the distance between P and B is 50m, and the line BP makes an angle of 80⁰ with AB. Find the radius of the curve.
